4. To test a hypothesis or an underlying bond between the variables.
5. To develop new ideas, insights, new styles and creative work.
6. To generate new theories for the sake of knowledge.
7. To face the challenge in solving the unsolved problems.
8. To Create and administer a research fund for the support of faculty members and students.

9. To Develop guidelines, procedures and principles for granting study leave, duty leave, reduction in workload, etc. for the faculty members those are indulge in research activities.
10. To Encourage and promote a research culture in the institute.
